EVERY DAY COUNTS!

Good attendance means being in school at least 96% of the time. This means missing no more than 7 days. Attendance is the greatest indicator of exam success. A student who misses class time often struggles to catch up and this may have an impact on academic progress. If your son or daughter misses 20 days at school we must notify the Education Welfare Officer. While we appreciate some absences are unavoidable students should only be taken out of school when absolutely necessary. Research has shown that poor attendance leads to poor exam results, early school leaving and poorer opportunities in life. It would be appreciated if parents could provide their child with a note from their doctor if there is an ongoing or prolonged health issue.
